A Letter From Our Chairman

Ambulance Service

For many years, the City of Oshkosh has been providing Emergency Medical Services, EMS (paramedics) to surrounding communities. The cost was reasonable at \$3.62 per capita. This year however, all communities were informed that the city decided to change their methodology in calculating the costs they will charge all communities. This has resulted in a cost increase to almost \$32 dollars per capita.



Since budget time is fast approaching, the town board will be “sharpening our pencils” to make sure this huge increase does not impact our tax levy too dramatically.

1. Bank First (Preferred Payment Method)

- In person payments or drive thru at 1159 N. Koeller St. Oshkosh, WI
- Operating hours are Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m.—4:30 p.m. & Drive Thru 8:00a.m.-5:30p.m.
- One check may be used for making multiple payments. A receipt will be provided.
Note: Dog licenses are only issued at Town Hall

2. Mail

- Town of Black Wolf 380 E. Black Wolf Ave. Oshkosh, WI 54902
- Check made payable to “Town of Black Wolf” if paying in full or 1st installment

3. Drop-Box

- Drop box is located to the left of front door and is available 24/7

DOG LICENSING INFORMATION

Town ordinance allows three (3) dogs per residence and licensing is governed by chapter 174 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Licenses cannot be processed without proof of current rabies vaccination.

Applications can be found on the Town website or by visiting the Town Hall. Fees are \$5 for neutered/spayed or \$10 unneutered/unsprayed. Applications, proof of rabies vaccination, and fee may be submitted to the Town Hall in-person, mail, or drop box.

Creamy Butternut Squash Pasta



INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 small butternut squash, halved vertically & seeded
- Sea salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 shallots, coarsely chopped (2/3 cup)
- 3 garlic cloves, unpeeled
- 3/4 cup water
- 1/2 cup raw cashews
- 2 Tblsp extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for drizzling
- 1 Tblsp nutritional yeast
- 1 Tblsp balsamic vinegar
- 10 fresh sage leaves
- 1 Tblsp fresh thyme leaves, plus more for garnish
- 12 ounces rotini pasta

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Preheat oven to 425 Degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper
2. Drizzle the squash with olive oil, sprinkle with salt and pepper, and place cut side down on the baking sheet. Wrap the shallots and garlic cloves in foil with a drizzle of olive oil and a pinch of salt and place on the baking sheet. Roast for 30 minutes, or until the squash is soft.
3. Measure 1 cup of the roasted squash flesh and transfer to a blender with the shallot, peeled garlic, water, cashews, olive oil. Nutritional yeast, vinegar, sage, thyme, 3/4 tsp salt, and several grinds of pepper. Blend until creamy.
4. Cook the pasta according to package directions in a pot of salted boiling water. Reserve 1 cup of the hot pasta water.
5. Drain the pasta and return to the pot. Stir in the sauce, adding 1/2-1 cup of reserved pasta water to loosen the sauce and coat the pasta. Season with salt, pepper, and a few thyme leaves & serve.

REGISTER TO VOTE!

*Register to vote in advance at
www.myvote.wi.gov*

All voters MUST provide a Proof of Residence Document. If you register to vote by mail, in-person in your clerk's office, with a Election Registration Official, or at your polling place on Election Day, you need to provide a Proof of Residence document.

The most common Proof of Residence documents are:

- A current and valid State of Wisconsin Driver License or State ID card.
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
- A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before Election Day.
- Bank/credit card statement.
- Paycheck or paystub.

ABSENTEE VOTING

The application for absentee voting can be found at www.myvote.wi.gov

Absentee ballots must be returned to the Town Hall via mail or hand-delivered to the clerk before polls close on election day, 8:00pm. Ballots will not be accepted via drop-box outside of Town Hall.

Follow instructions closely on the return envelope as ballots returned with missing information are considered invalid & therefore cannot be counted.

IN PERSON ABSENTEE VOTING

Voters may come during normal Town Hall business hours of M, T, TH, F from 11am-4pm to vote Absentee in person. Please call the office to schedule a time to absentee vote in person to avoid lengthy wait times and any unexpected coverage changes.



The DNR needs our help spreading crucial safety information across the state of Wisconsin. As of September 10th, 2024 **thirty people** have died in fatal ATV/UTV crashes ranging in ages from 4-79. A majority of the 2024 fatalities are reported to have not been wearing helmets or seatbelts. This information is accessible to the public on the WI DNR website and is regularly updated for the most accurate information. The WI DNR writes the following reminders:

“Riders should be sure to note that not all roads are open to these off-highway vehicles. Be sure to check with the county and municipality where you will ride to use routes open to ATV/UTVs, and only use those routes. More than half of the fatalities in 2024 have occurred on road routes and public roads closed to ATV/UTV traffic.

One of the best things ATV/UTV operators can do to operate safely is to take an online safety course. Wisconsin law requires ATV/UTV operators born on or after Jan. 1, 1988, who are at least 12 years old for an ATV (and at least 16 years old for UTV) to complete a safety certification course if riding on public lands, roads or another person’s property with permission.

Some additional things to keep in mind when operating your recreational vehicle include:

- Never consume alcohol or drugs before or during your ride.
- Do not travel in unfamiliar areas.
- Follow all posted speed limits and regulatory signs.
- Let someone not riding with you know where you are going and when you will return.”
